Weekly Data by Region, State, and Conflict Type









Between November 20 and 26, 2022, Nigeria recorded 26 violent conflict incidents across 16 states resulting in 90 casualties (deaths and injuries) and 75 kidnap victims. Despite a drop from the previous week in incident count (31) and casualties (110), the number of kidnap victims increased from 19 to 75. Plateau is the focal state for the week in terms of casualties, with one incident and 29 casualties (all civilian victims). Gunmen attacks on the Ser community in Bokkos Local Government Area of the state resulted in the recorded casualties. Furthermore, Zamfara state ranks the highest in kidnapping, with 68 kidnap victims from four incidents. Banditry has remained the focal violent conflict in the last three weeks. This week recorded 12 banditry incidents resulting in 63 casualties (deaths and injuries) and 72 kidnap victims. Gunmen attacks are the week's next most prevalent violent conflict, with five incidents resulting in 18 casualties and three kidnap victims. Violence remains prevalent in the northern region, with several states under attack.
