Between November 19th and 25th, 2023, 13 violent incidents resulted in 27 casualties (21 fatalities and six injured victims) and 13 kidnap victims. While violent incidents and casualty counts were reduced, the kidnap victims tally doubled compared to the previous week. Taraba state ranked the highest in fatality count, recording ten cases, due to an attack on Nyicwu village by bandits in Takum Local Government Area (LGA). Borno state also recorded the highest incident tally, with two cases involving members of Boko Haram and the Islamic State West Africa Provinces (ISWAP) and security personnel. Fifteen persons were abducted in Zamfara state within the same period. Gunmen violence remains the most common form of conflict, with one death and 11 kidnap victims from seven incidents. Banditry is second, with three incidents resulting in 18 fatalities and 15 kidnap victims. The North East region is the most troubled in this review week (19th November - 25th November 2023), with four violent incidents resulting in 17 casualties (11 fatalities and six injured victims).

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflict Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
