## Weekly Data by Region, State, and Conflict Type









Nigeria's battle with non-state actors continues as this review week (7th - 13th January 2024) recorded 18 violent incidents, resulting in 49 casualties (45 fatalities and four injured victims) and 131 kidnap victims across nine states. Katsina State ranked the highest in fatality count, recording 32 cases in the review week. The gun battle between the Nigerian Police and bandits in Danmusa Local Government Area (LGA) of the state contributed to the high fatality tally. Benue State recorded the highest incident tally, with four cases involving suspected herders and farmers, yet-to-be-identified gunmen, and civilians. Eighty-five persons were abducted in Kaduna State within the same period. Gunmen violence is the most reoccurring conflict in this review week (7th - 13th January 2024), resulting in two fatalities and 33 kidnap victims from five incidents. Banditry and farmer-herder conflicts are joint second with four incidents each, with the former recording 32 fatalities and 86 kidnap victims and the latter ten casualties (eight fatalities and two injured victims). North Central Nigeria is the most volatile region in the review period, recording seven incidents that resulted in eight fatalities and 43 kidnap victims.

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflict Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
