

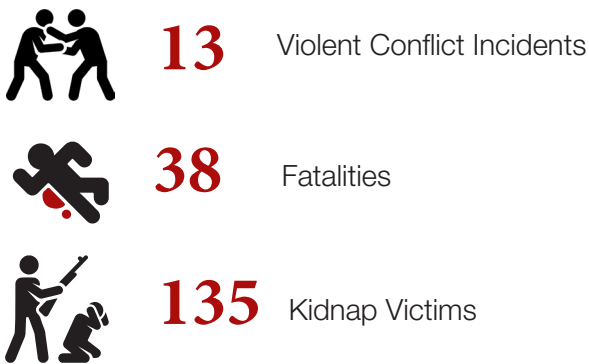

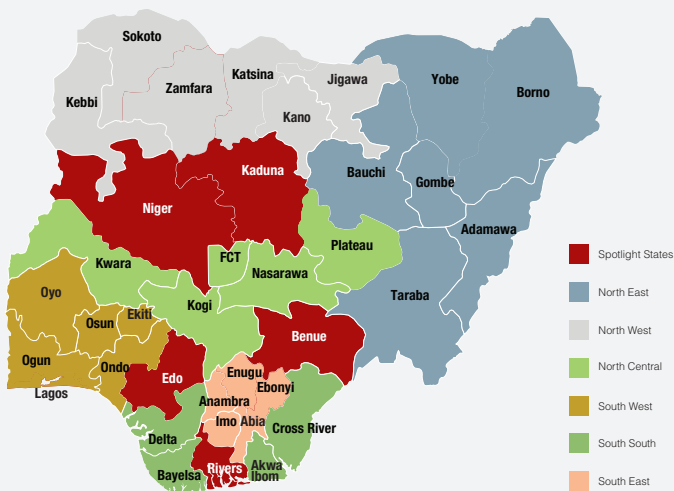

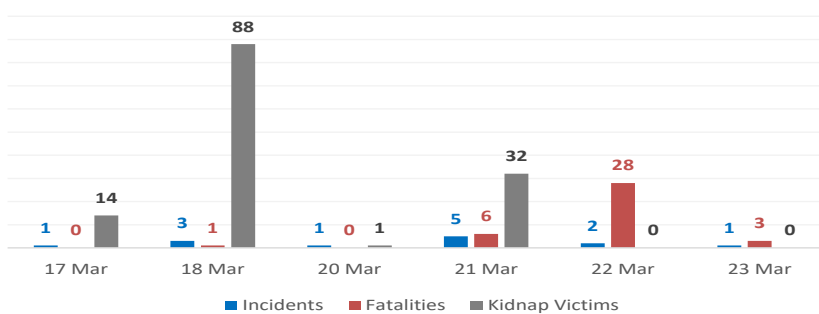

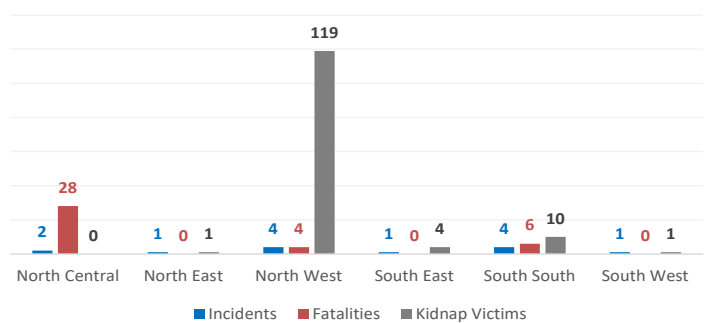

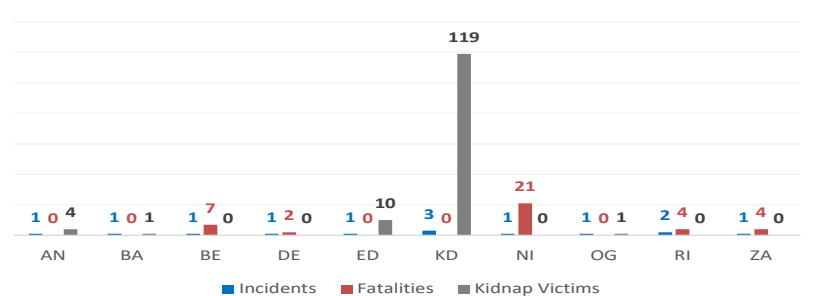

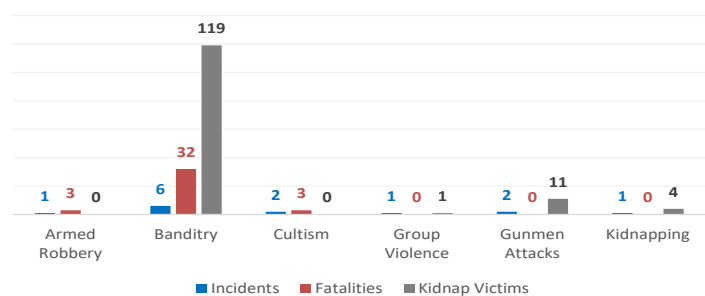
Nextier Violent Conflict Data by Region

In this review week (17th - 23rd March 2024), 13 violent conflict incidents resulted in 38 fatalities and 135 kidnap victims. Niger State recorded the most fatalities, with 21 cases in the review week due to a [bandit attack](#) on Madaka community in Rafi Local Government Area (LGA) of the state. For two weeks in a row (10th – 23rd March 2024), Kaduna State recorded the highest incident tally, with three cases in this review week involving bandits and civilians and the highest kidnap tally with 119 victims within the same period. Banditry is the prevalent violent conflict in this review week (March 17 - 23, 2024), with six incidents leading to 32 fatalities and 119 kidnap victims. North West and South-South Nigeria were the most volatile regions in this review period. Both regions recorded four incidents each, leading to six deaths and ten kidnap victims in the South-South region, and the North West region recorded four fatalities and 119 kidnap victims.

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflict Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
