

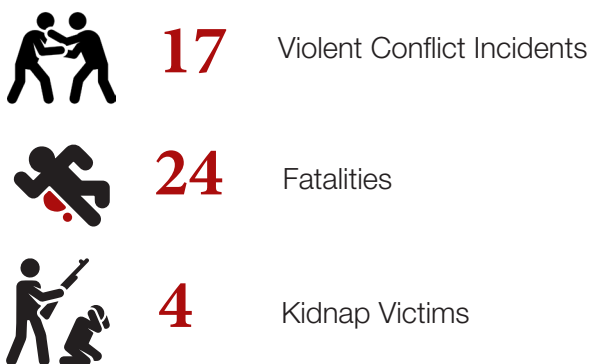

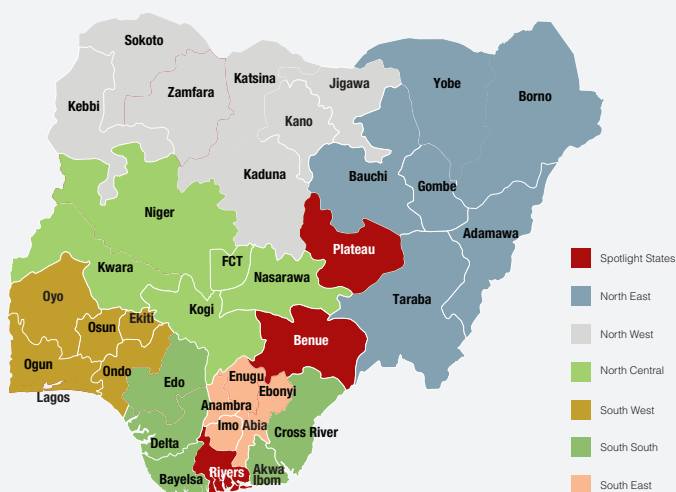

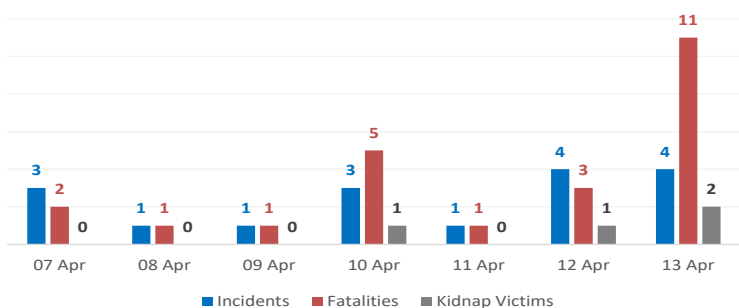

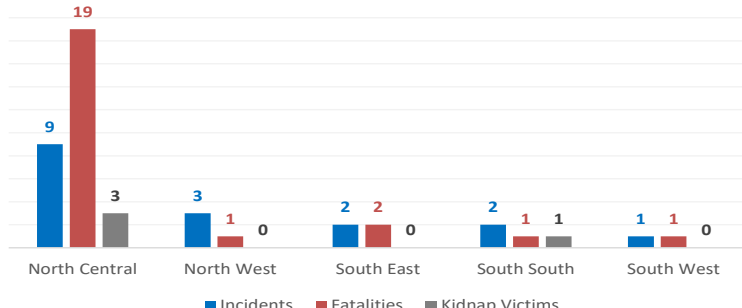

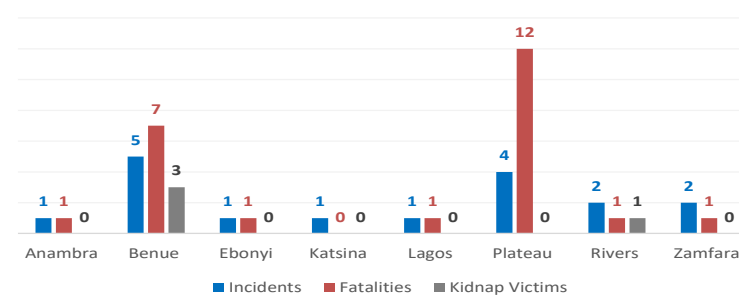

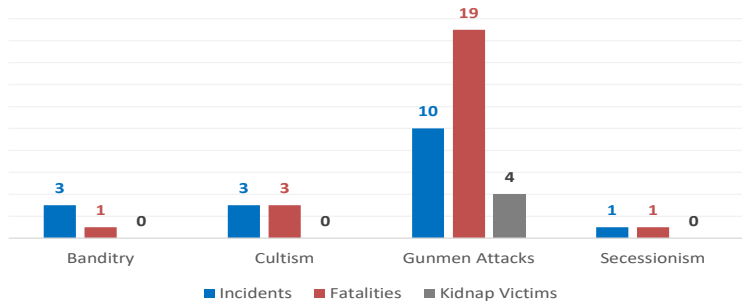
Nextier Violent Conflict Data by Region

The Nextier Violent Conflict Database recorded 17 violent incidents across eight Nigerian states between the 7th and 13th of April, 2024. These incidents resulted in 24 fatalities and four kidnap victims. Despite an unchanged incident tally, fatality and kidnap counts decreased by 31.4 per cent and 93.8 per cent, respectively, compared to the [previous week](#). Plateau State recorded the most fatalities, with 12 cases in the review week. The attacks on [communities](#) in Bokkos and Mangu LGAs contributed to the high tally. Benue State recorded the highest number of violent incidents (5) and kidnap tally (3) involving yet-to-be-identified gunmen and civilians within the same period (7th – 13th April 2024). Gunmen violence is the most common form of violent conflict in this review week, with ten incidents leading to 19 fatalities and four kidnap victims. North Central Nigeria remains the most volatile region in this review period, with 19 deaths and three kidnap victims from nine violent incidents.
