



This Week's Spotlight



Weekly Data by Region, State, and Conflict Type



In this review week (12th - 18th of May 2024), 19 violent incidents resulted in 81 casualties (80 fatalities and one injured person) and one kidnap victim across 13 Nigerian states. Compared to the <u>previous week</u>, the casualty count increased by 1.25 per cent, while violent incidents and kidnap count decreased by 24 and 98.1 per cent, respectively. Zamfara State recorded the most fatalities, with 27 cases even in this review week. The rivalry clash between two bandit groups in Sunke Forest of Anka LGA contributed to the high tally. Benue State recorded the highest number of violent incidents (4) involving suspected armed herders, yet-to-be-identified gunmen and civilians. Only two kidnap cases were recorded in the review week (12th - 18th May 2024). While Anambra State had one kidnap victim, the victim count of Kogi State's incident is still unknown. Gunmen violence is the most common violent conflict in this review week, with seven incidents leading to 20 casualties (19 fatalities and one injured victim) and one kidnap victim. North Central Nigeria is the most volatile region in this review period, with 24 deaths from seven violent incidents.

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
