




Violent Conflict Summary 25 Violent Conflict Incidents 80 Casualties 54 Kidnap Victims



This Week's Spotlight



Weekly Data by Region, State, and Conflict Type



Between the 5th and 11th of May 2024, Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database recorded 25 violent incidents, which resulted in 80 casualties (64 fatalities and 16 injured persons) across 14 Nigerian states. Zamfara State recorded the most fatalities, with 25 cases in the review week. The attack by bandits on Bilbis community in Tsafe LGA contributed to the high tally. Enugu and Zamfara States recorded the highest number of violent incidents, with four each involving bandits, security personnel, civilians and suspected members of the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB). Kaduna State recorded the most kidnap cases, with 18 victims from one incident within the same period (5th – 11th May 2024). Banditry remains the prevalent violent conflict in this review week, with nine incidents leading to 44 casualties (36 fatalities and eight injured victims) and 33 kidnap victims. North West Nigeria is the most volatile region in this review period, with 44 casualties (36 deaths and eight wounded victims) and 24 kidnap victims from eight violent incidents.

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
