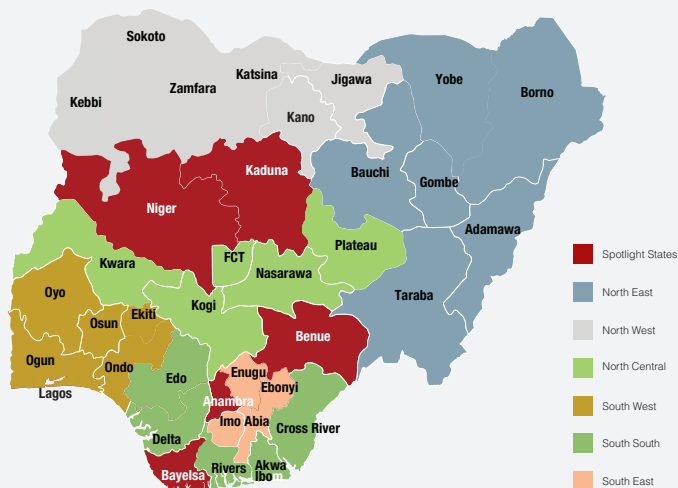

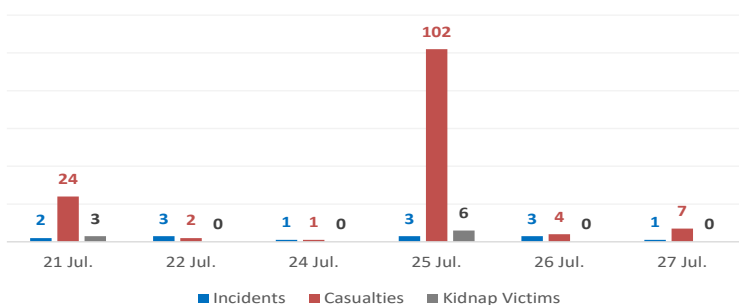

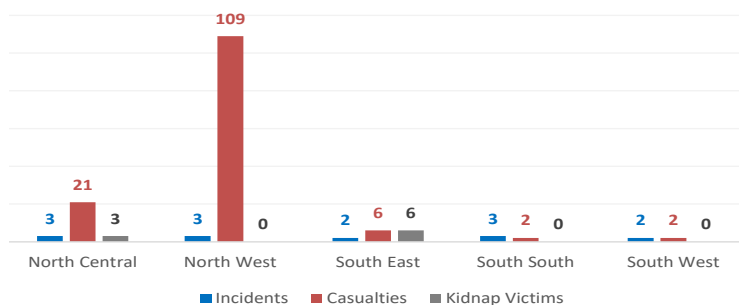

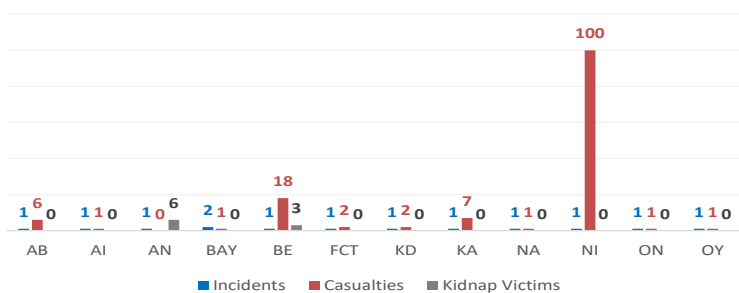

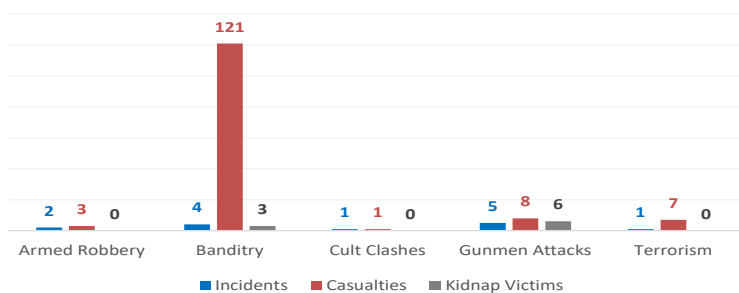
Nextier Violent Conflict Data by Region

From July 21 to 27, 2024, Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database recorded 13 violent incidents that resulted in 140 casualties (139 fatalities and one injured person) and nine kidnap victims. Despite a reduced violent incident count, the casualty count increased compared to the [previous week](#). Niger State recorded the most fatalities, with 100 cases due to a [joint operation](#) of military and vigilantes on bandits in Kundu area of Wushishi Local Government Area (LGA). Bayelsa State recorded the highest number of violent conflict incidents (2) involving armed robbers, yet-to-be-identified gunmen, and civilians. Anambra State recorded the highest number of kidnap victims (6) within the same period (July 21 - 27, 2024). Gunmen violence remains the prevalent violent conflict type, with five incidents that led to eight casualties (seven fatalities and one injured person) and six kidnap victims. North Central, North West and South-South are the most troubled regions in this review period, with three incidents each that resulted in three deaths and three kidnap victims in the North Central, 109 fatalities in the North West and two fatalities in the South-South.

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
