



Weekly Data by Region, State, and Conflict Type



Between the 4th and 10th of August 2024, eighteen violent incidents resulted in 63 casualties (58 fatalities and five injured persons) and 37 kidnap victims. All three parameters (incidents, casualties and kidnap count) increased compared to the <u>previous week</u>. Benue State recorded the most fatalities, with 18 cases, largely due to <u>bandits attack</u> on Ayati village of Ukum Local Government Area (LGA). Kaduna State recorded the highest number of violent conflict incidents (four) involving bandits, security personnel and civilians, and it also recorded the highest number of kidnap victims, with 37 victims within the same period. Banditry is the most common form of conflict, accounting for five incidents that resulted in 25 fatalities and 37 kidnap victims. North Central Nigeria is the most affected region in this review period (August 4th -10th, 2024), with six incidents that resulted in 34 casualties (30 fatalities and four injured persons).

The data presented in this report are from Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database which collates violent conflict incidents across Nigeria from field sources and media-reported violent conflict incidents.
