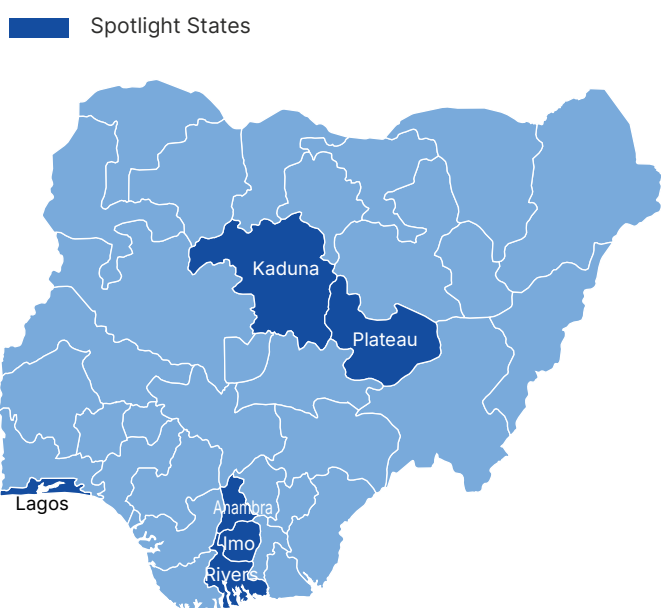

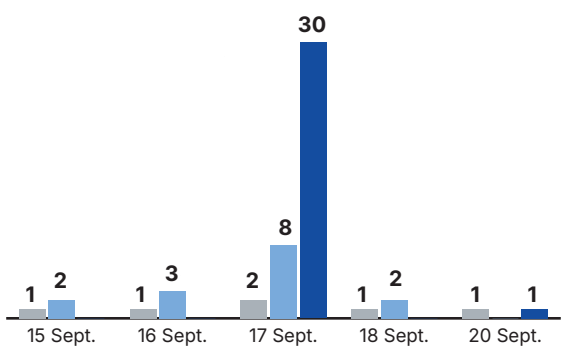

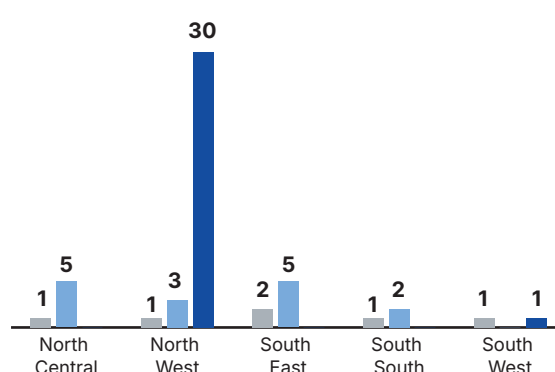

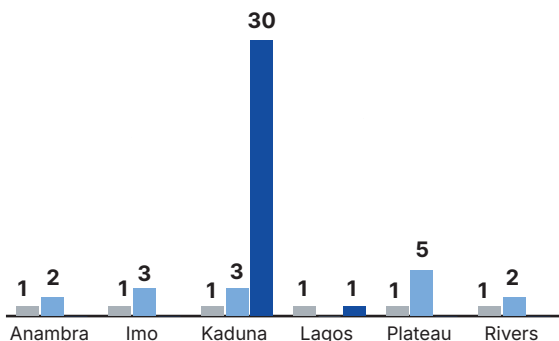

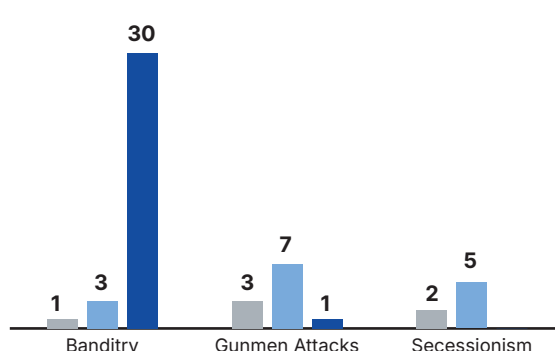
Nextier Violent Conflict Data by Region

Across six Nigerian states, Nextier's Nigeria Violent Conflicts Database recorded six violent incidents, resulting in 15 fatalities and 31 kidnap victims between the 15th and the 21st of September, 2024. In this week's review, the kidnap count increased compared to the [previous week](#). Plateau state has the highest number of fatalities, with five cases, due to [an attack](#) on Mbar community of Bokkos Local Government Area by unidentified armed men. All six states recorded one incident each involving bandits, yet-to-be-identified gunmen, suspected members of the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB) and security personnel. Kaduna State recorded the most kidnap cases, with 30 victims from one incident. Gunmen violence is the prevalent violent conflict for the week, with seven fatalities and one kidnap victim from three incidents. Secessionism is second, with two incidents resulting in five deaths. The South East region of the country is the most troubled in the review period, with two incidents that led to five deaths.
